If you are at all considering neurolinguistic psychotherapy as a profession, please check the NLPtCA accreditation criteria as they will only accept certain courses that tend to be of higher quality and suitable as a foundation for psychotherapeutic work. Equivalent constraints may apply for NLP coaching.

NLP training courses are not substitutes for personal counselling or psychotherapy. We strongly advise that you seek assistance to resolve any major personal issues ahead of commencing training, so that you and your trainee colleagues will be free to enjoy the best possible learning experiences.

Here are some basic criteria which you may find helpful to consider:

- ☑ How will the course meet my particular needs or purpose?
- ☑ When is a good time to make this kind of personal and financial investment?
- ☑ Reputation and experience of the training school
- ☑ Will I get the trainer advertised, or someone else?
- ☑ Class size may be small, or over 100 both have pros and cons
- ☑ What's the ratio of coaching assistants to the number of trainees?
- ☑ How well does each company "walk the talk" when handling my enquiries?
- ☑ Amount of home study if it's a part-correspondence course?
- ☑ Is there phone or e-support available for any home study?
- ☑ Adequate opportunity to practice skills during and after training
- ☑ Quality of certification (preferably INLPTA or ANLP)
- ☑ Total cash cost of the course
- ☑ Instalment or discount schemes
- ☑ Cost of travel, hotel accommodation and meals
- ☑ Time sacrifice (personal vs. work time)
- ☑ Will my certification be acceptable for what I want to do with it next?
